Dear Premier Redford,

On behalf of Citizens for Public Justice, a national organization of members inspired by faith to act for justice in Canadian public policy, I congratulate you on your recent electoral victory.

We particularly commend you for your party's decision to initiate development of a Social Policy Framework to guide the development of Alberta's public services. In particular, we note your party's election commitment to establish a bold provincial poverty reduction strategy to eliminate children's poverty in 5 years and to reduce poverty amongst other age groups over 10 years. Nearly 400,000 Albertans – 25 per cent of whom are children – live in poverty, exacting significant social and economic (estimated to be as high as \$9.5 billion per year) costs. In committing to a poverty reduction strategy, you've wisely identified this injustice as something we simply cannot afford to ignore.
